

Quality Improvement Highlights & Client Feedback

January to March 2015

Lutheran Community Services Northwest tracks progress towards the achievement of five "ends" (goals) associated with our agency's lines of service:

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

People reconcile the past and embrace the future with hope.

- 93% of clients measured in the Mental Health Program in Crook County had stable or improved GAF scores above a target of 90%. In addition to beating target, the success this quarter is that 116 clients were included in the analysis. A focus from local quality improvement staff about the consistent reporting of GAF scores is paying off!
- **95%** of clients in the SAFeT Advocacy Program in Spokane were aware of resources in the community above a target of **90%**.
- 100% of 35 clients measured in the SAFeT Clinical Program in Spokane had stable or improved scores on a self-reported Likert scale above a target of 80%. This is an improvement from the past four quarters.
- 98% of clients measured in the Mental Health Program in Klamath County had stable
 or improved GAF scores above a target of 90%. This is a strong result and shows a
 successful shift to serving a different population. The Mental Health Program in the
 Klamath office is serving an increasing number of clients with Severe and Persistent
 Mental Illness (SPMI).
- .71 is the Severity Adjusted Effect Size (SAES) for the General Counseling Program in Portland, above a target of .5. The SAES is a standardized method for reporting preand post-test change using an ACORN tool. The average for mental health practitioners on this measure is .63 and a .5 indicates an "effective" program.

CHILD WELFARE

Children at risk are in a safe and stable environment.

- 70% of clients in the Therapeutic Foster Care program in Spokane Washington graduated to a lower level of care above a target of 65%. This is the first quarter in over a year that the program has met target. We are excited and cautiously optimistic that this is a sign that the hard work and intense focus on this program is paying off. Will continue to monitor outcome for trends.
- **92%** of clients in the In-Home Safety and Reunification Services Program in Yamhill Count progressed towards treatment goals above a target of **90%**.
- 100% of children who had been served by the Relief Nursery for at least 6 months were able to stay in their homes. This matches a target of 100% and shows program success in strengthening families.

SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DIABILITIES

Seniors and people with disabilities acquire and sustain maximum independence, well-being, and health.

- 96% of clients served in the Home Care program in South Puget Sound were able to remain in their own homes above a target of 85%. This program shows consistent success in this outcome.
- 100% of participants in the Support U class reported a greater sense of well-being above a target of 85%. This is strong and encouraging. Satisfaction surveys show that clients appreciate the information shared during the classes.

"Words cannot explain how much my Companion means to me. Before I had been struggling even beyond my own capabilities to shop for groceries and get them to my apartment. I didn't remember to go to my doctor's appointments and never had the stamina or a companion to do anything fun. I was depressed and lonely. Trying so hard to remain independent. I've been in nursing homes 5 or 6 times for rehabilitation after hospitalizations and honestly I'd rather die here in my own home/apartment than go back to one. I can't afford to hire more help so your program means everything to me. Thank you over and over again."

REFUGEES AND IMMIGRANTS

Refugees and immigrants successfully integrate into their new communities.

- 99% of clients in the Resettlement and Placement (R&P) Program from Seattle, Vancouver and Tacoma had resources to meet their basic needs above a target of 95%. This outcome includes data from three separate offices and demonstrates consistency in program quality.
- 58% of clients taking English as a Second Language (ESL) classes gained an entire language level above a target of 45%. This is a strong result because it is a significant accomplishment for a student to gain an entire level in one quarter. Our ESL Program in Vancouver continues to do well in comparison to other programs in the state.
- 100% of clients served by the Immigration Counseling and Advocacy Program (ICAP) in Yamhill County indicated that services helped them achieve legal status above a target of 75%.

FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Families and individuals achieve well-being and work together to promote justice and build safe, caring communities.

- 96% of clients in the Valley Individual Development Account (VIDA) program met their planned savings goals above a target of 95%.
- 100% of parents participating in the Parent Education Program in Yamhill County reported improved skills in communicating with their child(ren) above a target of 75%. Also 96% reported improved skills in supporting children above a target of 75%. The Parent Education Program was happy to report a much improved quality improvement process that was implemented this quarter with much more consistent in both conducting, reviewing and reporting the results for the community.
- 100% of participants in the Bridging the Gap Seminar in Crook County reported that they learned how to protect children from parental conflict above a target of 80%.
