LCSNW: Rich in History



The origin of LCSNW predates the Great Depression to 1921, with the founding of the Lutheran Compass Mission in Tacoma, WA. The mission served the "down and out" individuals and families in the community. In 1926, caring Lutherans in Portland organized a similar outreach effort known as the Lutheran Welfare Society. As human suffering escalated during the 1930s, Northwest Lutherans increased their efforts to provide clothing, bedding, food and shelter to the homeless.



In the 1940s, LCSNW resettled refugees from Eastern Europe and started offering adoption services. The Spokane office opened in 1956 and the Tri-Cities office opened in 1964, focusing on mental health and marriage and family counseling. In the 1970s and 80s, LCSNW expanded services for refugees and unaccompanied minors, senior services grew in Tacoma and the Rape Crisis Center opened in Spokane. In 2001, LCSNW of Washington and Idaho joined with Lutheran Family Services of Oregon and SW Washington, to form Lutheran Community Services Northwest.

It's a New Day at LCSNW



LCSNW was established in Crook County in 1984 and was contracted as the County Mental Health Provider. The Bend Clinic was launched in 2011 and Hope Academy in Terrebonne in 2016.

Currently, LCSNW Central Oregon employs over 80 employees in Crook and Deschutes Counties. Approximately, 60 of those employees are located in the 13 acre, 98,000 square foot property that was once the Pioneer Memorial Hospital.
