I never imagined living past the age of 19. Growing up, I didn't feel safe at home. My father lived on the wrong side of the law and never made time for me. My mom worked two jobs to keep our family afloat, and I didn't have the emotional support of my family that every child needs.



Much of my youth was spent alone. I mostly existed in a comatose state and I often contemplated suicide. Our family trailer felt more like hell than a home. I turned to drinking and drugs in middle school. But, I wanted more from life. In eighth grade, I poured myself into learning and I earned a spot on our chool's honor roll. But, there was nobody to share in my accomplishment and no reason to think my situation would change.

I began to find hope my freshman year when I was introduced to Lutheran Community Services Northwest (LCS) in Kennewick. My teacher at Phoenix High School steered me to the Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe) program. The staff at LCS listened to me and empowered me to lift myself up. They didn't tell me what to do. They helped me find my voice and create the change that I wanted and needed.

They brought together a team to support me that included my mom. Together, we discovered my strengths and created a plan to overcome my challenges and help me reach my goals. My mental health needs were addressed through therapy. I began to open up about my trauma and started to discover who I am.

My life improved. I became the student body vice president at my school, and followed that with two years as president. I volunteered to help lead the Family and Youth System Partner Round Table (FYSPRT), where I continue to advocate for youth with mental health challenges throughout Washington State. I graduated from the WISe program and from high school. I have opportunities to attend college. I am happy with who I am, and I want to to help youth like me overcome their mental health challenges.
