- Support you in reporting to law enforcement and/ or Child Protective Services

- Help you with protection orders
- Help you apply for Crime Victims Compensation
- Refer you to community resources
- Facilitate support groups to encourage positive coping/healing
- Connect you to Walker, our Courthouse Facility Dog
- Listen, support and believe you



Youth and Family Advocacy

In Washington State, child victims or witnesses have the following rights:

- · Receive an age appropriate explanation of process
- Receive a written statement of the rights of child crime victims
- Have an advocate or support person present
- Have a secure waiting area during court proceedings
- Have personal information protected from uninvolved outside parties
- Have an advocate make recommendations on the minor's behalf
- Receive referrals to community resources
